JARE Research Project

- Japan Related Research Project (Sumitomo Grant).
- Open annually.
- **Eligible projects:** Any research project to be carried out by individual or a group in the field of the social sciences or humanities that is related to Japan.
- **Qualification:** Researcher shall be of Asian (non Japanese) nationality, living outside Japan. Awarded researcher must conduct the proposed research by themselves.

JARE Research Project

Fiscal 2023 Program:

- ▶ Application period : September 1 ~ October 31, 2023
- ▶ Grant period : One year (April 2024 through March 2025)
In unavoidable case during the research period, it can be extended for total two years maximum upon request.
- ▶ Grant budget : ¥50 million in total, with 70 projects to be selected

Selection:

The selection of applications will be made by the Foundation's Selection Committee made up of certain persons of high academic standing. Based on such determination, the Foundation's Board of Directors will approve the grant.

Research Proposal

Concept of research project, consists of:

- particular motivations leading to the Research Project: e.g. importance of coral reef for ecosystem, it is more and more degraded, need a restoration.
- the significance of the Research Project: e.g. So far, the restoration project has not explored the human aspect in the context of the relationship with the marine conservation area.
- a comparison between this Research Project and other domestic or foreign projects: e.g. The previous studies that explored the human aspect related to the relationship with the marine conservation area are still limited.

I strongly recommend **Budiyanto Dwi Prasetyo's** application for a comparative study of **community and local government participation in coral reef restoration**. Mr Prasetyo and his Indonesian and Japanese colleagues will conduct qualitative research using interviews with key stakeholders in Okinawa and West Java to understand how local institutions and communities participation in protecting and restoring critical marine biodiversity.

Tips

- Eksplorasi gap pada project riset sebelumnya untuk kemudian diolah jadi proposal.
- Kontekstualisasikan topik yang dipilih dengan kasus serupa yang ada di Jepang.
- Pilih topik yang simple tapi belum pernah/tidak ada dalam list penerima grant.
- Topik riset berupa comparative study Indonesia dan Jepang (sesuai tujuan grant).
- Jejaring kerja (networks) untuk membentuk tim (kolega di site riset dan di jepang).
- Kepakaran dan etos kerja: multi-disiplin, pembagian tugas (substansi, kontak person, keuangan, administrasi persuratan).
- Assertive dan inisiatif, tidak saling tunggu.
- Read the instructions.
- Tulis proposal jauh sebelum tanggal submission. The power of “kepepet” is not always good.
- Surat Rekomendasi dari dosen/prof. pembimbing S2/S3.
- Selalu peer review setiap progress pembuatan proposal. Baik oleh anggota tim, maupun dari pihak luar tim.
- Selalu cek email terdaftar.
- Berdoa untuk yang terbaik.
- Proposal tidak lolos bukan berarti jelek, bisa diolah lagi untuk grant lainnya.
